The More You Know—Part 4

The more we know about God, the more we will trust him and want to get to know him. Our view of God matters. Is it possible to know what God is like?

The Bible does not make any attempt to prove that God exists. It just assumes he does. The first book of the Bible Genesis begins, “In the beginning, God created... The story continues on from there Let’s dig in to understand more.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. When you were growing up, what did you think God was like? In other words, what was your view of God? Has your view of God changed over the years? Explain your answer.
2. Read Romans 1:18-23. What are some ways that God’s attributes are seen through creation? (For example, the sun reveals the glory of God.)
3. Read Jeremiah 32:17-23. What are some of the things we learn about God from these verses?
4. Read Psalm 147:4-5 and Job 38:1-8. Why should we be encouraged that is omniscient—that he knows all things. (See also Proverbs 2:6 and James 1:5).
5. Read Genesis 1:1-5, Matthew 19:16 and Hebrews 11:3. What are some things we learn about God’s power from these verses? Why is it encouraging to know that God is all-powerful (the Almighty)? In what ways have you seen God’s power in your life?
6. Read Psalm 139:7-12. How would you define “omni-presence?” How is omni-presence different from the idea that God is in everything? How should the omni-presence of God influence how we live our lives?
7. Of the three attributes we’ve talked about tonight—God’s omniscience, his omnipotence and his omni-presence—which one is most meaningful to you right now?

APPLICATION

In today’s message, we learn that God is all-knowing. He is aware of everything and exists everywhere. God has omniscience, omnipresence, and omnipotence. God’s omnipresence means we are not alone—he is with us wherever we go. Omniscience relates to God’s knowledge of all things past, present, and future. God’s omnipotence refers to his ability to cause anything to happen.

Because of those characteristics, God sees us always. He sees when we are doing what we shouldn’t be doing. We may be able to hide things from other people, but we can never hide from God. He is always with us—even when we think God isn’t there because he isn’t intervening to fix something we asked for. We have to trust that God knows what’s best because he is all-knowing. He is able to help us through his presence, his power, his wisdom and knowledge. There is no limit to what he can do and provide for
